REASONS FOR THE PROJECT

Reasons for the project

- 1) Closest sporting club = Matane 280 km + Balmoral 160 km
- 2) No secure location for the federal firearm licence training class
- 3) No designated area for professionals to practice: SQ, DOT, GARDA, Guards, Fisheries officers
- 4) Nowhere to practice bow / crossbow and sight-in properly
- 5) The actual sites being used are dangerous, not supervised
- 6) The gravel pit sites are dangerous for the environment and pose a risk to the workers and equipment
- 7) Without a proper site, we will never inspire a safe and secure mentally around hunting, sighting in scopes and safety
- 8) The sport of shooting: whether hang gun, skeet or rifle are recognized Olympic sports

TYPE OF COURSES THAT WILL BE OFFERED TO THE POPULATION

1. Canadian Firearm Safety Course (CFSC)

The training provided prepares students with beginner-level knowledge on the responsibilities of possessing and using non-restricted firearms, their safe use and handling as well as storage of firearms and ammunition. The course takes a minimum of 8 hours to complete not including the written and practical test.

2. Canadian Restricted Firearm Safety Course (CRFSC)

The training provided prepares students with beginner-level knowledge on the responsibilities of possessing and using restricted firearms, their safe use and handling as well as storage of firearms and ammunition. (This course requires successful completion of the CFSC course to participate). The course takes a minimum of 6 hours to complete not including the written and practical test.

3. BILL 9 COMPETENCY TEST

The competency test is mandatory for shooters who use restricted firearms and who want to join a shooting club. The same applies for owners of a restricted firearm who want to renew their membership to a shooting club and who have not practiced the sport of target shooting for at least one year. [Section 46.29]

4. COURSE FOR RANGE OFFICER

The range officer is responsible for the safety of shooters and spectators at the shooting range. The aim of the course is to provide adequate training to individuals who wish to be involved and act with regards to safety on sites where non-restricted and restricted firearms are used.

SERVICES OFFERED TO THE POPULATION

- 1. Shooting practice with supervision and advice
- 2. Zeroing and scope sight-in services depending on ammunition and calibre
- 3. Regional, provincial and national competitions













BAS ST-LAURENT – 1.5 km




MATANE – 1 km




BALMORAL – NB – 3.1 km



New Carlisle – 8.4 km






NEW CARLISLE


- ▶ 6 KM North of the last house in New Carlisle


